VIII. VALLEJO POLICE DEPARTMENT UPDATES

Sergeant Rashaad Hollis, Public Information Officer for Vallejo Police Department, reported the Solano County Sheriff's Department will be supporting Vallejo Police in the community, patrolling beats 2, 3 and 4, along east and south Vallejo. The Sheriff will assist in patrolling south Vallejo from Georgia Street down to the Carquinez Bridge. On the east side will be Redwood Street down to Glen Cove. The lineup for the Sheriff's unit will consist of a Watch Commander, a Sergeant managing their patrols and six Deputies. The hours of patrol are from 2:00 p.m. to midnight, Wednesday through Saturday. Sergeant Hollis said the extra support from the county will help with staffing, saturated policing, visibility and proactivity for training and more officers coming aboard. Sergeant Hollis said four new Vallejo Police officers were recently added to the force. The additional patrol units will be visible around the following school sites: Jesse Bethel High School, Hogan Middle, Steffan Manor Elementary, Glen Cove Elementary, Pennycook Elementary, Cave Language Academy, Wardlaw Elementary, and Vallejo Adult Schools.

Chief Jason Ta, Vallejo Police Department, confirmed the County Sheriff's Deputies had their first day in Vallejo on Wednesday, January 21, 2026. Chief Ta said the partnership with the county will help with response times and getting to know the departments before there are unforeseeable emergency events that happen when no planning is involved. Chief Ta is committed to the partnership with VCUSD and possibly having the Sheriff's Department as the

point of contact with the schools in the future. Chief Ta spoke about initiatives the City will be implementing in 2026 regarding sex abuse or sex trafficking and will explore communicating with the schools on the program. Chief Ta said he's looking into adding new police officers every year, with a modest increase of approximately 5–7 officers each year, up to 15 officers total. The conversation regarding School Resource Officers may not come up for about a year. Vice President Flores asked for more police presence during the school pick-up and drop-off areas along the City Park area where kids witness inappropriate activity in the area. Sergeant Hollis said he will address that concern. Chief Ta said to be aware the staff is limited around that time in the morning, but they will have more help in the afternoon and the days the county is patrolling and it has to also be compared to what's going on in the city where resources may have to be used first.

X. DISCUSSION ITEMS

A. Nebraska Street Closure Update

Interim Public Works Director Oscar Alcantar reported the city has the funds for the traffic-calming. He introduced Robert Briseno, PIO reported updated information and said the strategy and conversation about the loss of approximately 45 parking spaces when the street closure happens and how to address it.

B. Future Uses of VCUSD School Sites

Superintendent Rubén Aurelio reported updates regarding the closures of three schools, future budget cuts, supporting the future uses of District properties and creating more partnerships in the community. Mayor Sorce thanked VCUSD and the Board for their outreach and communications with the community regarding the transitions, repurposing school sites, and building the momentum for change.

C. Defining the Mission and Intent of the 2 x 2 Committee

Vice Mayor J.R. Matulac said the committee is typically used for collaboration of ideas between the city and the school district. Vice President Flores said he feels the mission and intent should be 50-50, sharing the responsibility of the children and citizens of Vallejo. When students are at home and in the community, we need the city's support. Vice Mayor Matulac said those conversations have begun, and the City Youth Coordinator will address some of the programs and collaborations the city and VCUSD are doing to engage students and young people. Mayor Sorce said for the past year they've been proactive and reactive together.

XI. YOUTH COORDINATOR UPDATES

A. Vallejo Youth Delegation to Washington, D.C.

Victoria Grace-Barksdale, Youth Coordinator, City of Vallejo, reported the Youth Delegate Conference in Washington, D.C., is sold out, but they have an alternative itinerary for the youth from March 14-17, 2026. The applications will go out to VCUSD students in February. The 2 + 2 members will be asked to vet the applications for selection of the students who will attend. The Youth Delegates will present to the City Council and School Board members, information about their previous trip to Utah.

B. Prop 64 Grant

Ms. Grace-Barksdale reported, the City of Vallejo won a grant from taxing marijuana businesses in the city. Those funds will be used to promote the negative affects of the use of marijuana. There are also efforts to expand the substance abuse programs and workshops to more local school sites.

XII. ACTION CALENDAR

A community member asked to calendar Safe Routes to Schools, a Bicycle Fair, possibly at Dan Mini Elementary School and St. Patricks High School. The community member asked that the Sherriff Department hang out around the schools more and he's glad about the leadership roles being created for youth in Vallejo.

XIV. INFORMATION CALENDAR

A. Superintendent Rubén Aurelio - Updates and Changes within the Vallejo City Unified School District

Superintendent Rubén Aurelio reported the VCUSD Board took action to close three schools; Highland, Lincoln and Pennycook Elementary Schools. Those students and staff will be disbursed to Cooper, Federal Terrace, Steffan Manor and Glen Cove Elementary Schools, due to declining enrollment and leading up to a \$22 million cut. Superintendent Aurelio reported the transfer process has been updated, and the information is on the District

website. The change in the enrollment process will limit 80–100 interdistrict transfers, which was 500–1000 students in the past.

XV. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Vice President Flores said he would like to see a financial infrastructure of what it would look like for more biking corridors for students.

Vice Mayor Matulac said the Nebraska Street closure updates and continue Discussion Items B (Future uses of VCUSD School Sites) and C (Defining the Mission and Intent of the 2 x 2 Committee).
