

**1. CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 6:08 p.m.

**2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

**4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

**5. UPDATE ON PUBLIC SAFETY ITEMS**

**A UPDATE ON THE FOLLOWING PUBLIC SAFETY ITEMS**

- Operations Report, Staffing and Crime Data
- Domestic Crime Violence

**Police Operations Report Including Recruitment & Hiring:** Deputy Chief Knight reported that VPD uses the CGIS (crime mapping & crime data) system. All crimes are reported to NIBERS (National Incident Based Reporting System). The information in CGIS is the same as reported in Nibers. Currently there are 39 officers on patrol due to recent promotions and P.O.P. team creation. VPD has a baseline to have 48 patrol officers. Deputy Chief Knight expects the number of patrol officers to increase soon.

Council member Matias asked about National crime statistics related to assaults. Councilmember Matias would like to know VPD's opinion on the rising trends and possible solutions and the metrics related to investments the COV has made in crime deterrence.

DC Knight will research national trends in assaults and report back.

DC Knight proposed that Average Response Times is a good way to measure VPD's service to the community.

Council member Palmares discusses the 474 domestic violence crimes reported in Vallejo. He asks who the prolific offenders are and if domestic violence and kidnapping overlap.

DC Knight shared that 9 out of 15 vehicle fatalities happen on Sonoma Blvd. The traffic division meets quarterly with the COV traffic engineers (looking to invite Caltrans) The traffic division is applying for an OTS grant (DUI, traffic safety, marketing campaigns, etc.). VPD has not applied recently due to traffic division staffing issues.

Councilmember Matias expressed the view that the City Manager ought to consult with Caltrans regarding Sonoma Blvd He asks if the new paving project includes traffic calming measures or additional lighting.

Councilmember Matias asked about calls for service. He noticed an increase in calls for service meaning the word is out that Vallejo PD is showing up and helping. He was alarmed by the Kidnapping/Abduction statistics.

Councilmember Palmares mentioned he met with Caltrans at least two times in the past but since then there has been no response. He requested Caltrans hold a community forum to discuss the paving project and receive feedback.

## **6. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE REVIEW**

### **A CONTINUANCE OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE & CASE REVIEW**

Deputy Chief Knight discussed Domestic Violence (DV) and started a conversation related to repeat DV offenders. The Gun Violence Restraining Order is in review with Human Resources. DC Knight recognized the community partners in the audience and emphasized the need for resources being funneled to the DV victims. Sgt. Caitham discussed impacting victims' lives other than just responding to the 911 call. He mentioned the resource card, which was discussed previously. The card is being revised and suggested "one" singular card be used county wide. Following requests initiated by the council and community members, VPD staff have identified the apartment complexes with the most DV incidents Sgt. Caitham mentioned there will be a 2-day training course for all VPD officers related to the Felony Assessment Protocol-or Lethality Assessment under DV. It is suggested that all officers and especially Communication Operators attend. Council Members formally requested receiving an email invitation to participate in the training. VPD to develop a name for the Lethality Assessment.

DC Knight acknowledged the City's Community Partners-SANE SART, Kaiser Permanente, and the Family Justice Center that were present this evening.

**PARTNERSHIP GUEST COMMENTS:**

Ms. Cordero (SANE SART) (Child Advocacy Center) suggested a lethality review to include a forensic review (death review team related to DV).

Ms. Sandoval/ Ramirez (Family Justice Center) shared the FJC is open Monday-Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and are located at 604 Empire Street, Fairfield CA 94533. Survivors can use any of the facilities located in Solano or Contra Costa County. She also suggests a singular resource card that all agencies can use. The Center is DOJ trauma informed, trained and certified.

Survivors needing off hours may reach out 24/hr. to Safe Quest Solano at 866-487-7233. Safe Quest also has text messaging services available Monday-Friday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The text messaging number is 707-237-8397.

Additional Information: Currently to obtain a Forensic Exam, a police officer must make a request. There is a response time of 16 minutes per exam. There are no out of pocket costs for the survivor, as many survivors have their insurance tied to the abuser. Ms. Sandoval/Ramirez shared that it is difficult to find immediate removal or placement for a survivor. The Center uses ReLo Share, a nationwide housing program resource that assists in providing a few days of relocation for the survivor. The number one advantage in helping the survivor is to identify a plan within the first 48 hours. When more time passes the victim usually returns to the abusive environment.

**ACTION ITEMS:**

Councilmember Matias requested the development of the following three items:

- Awareness Campaign related to Trafficking.
- Emergency Shelter Funding.
- Name of the Program- include an action plan, timelines, and specifically funding needs. If needed, it will be elevated to the full Council.

requested information on the role of Season of Sharing in Solano County, including whether the program could provide assistance.

**7. IDENTIFY ITEMS FOR SUBCOMMITTEE TO AGENDIZE FOR FUTURE MEETINGS**

- Councilmember Matias requested the City Manager’s Office, in coordination with Cal OES, to follow up on available emergency housing and related resources. He asked for clarification on the deliverables associated with community-serving expenditures, including resources provided by Kaiser. Additionally, he expressed his intent to bring forward a \$50,000 RFP for gun violence prevention for Council consideration. Councilmember Lediju requested that the domestic violence resource card issued for DV include a statement clarifying that access to funding is not dependent on spousal coverage.

**8. ADJOURNMENT**

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 p.m.

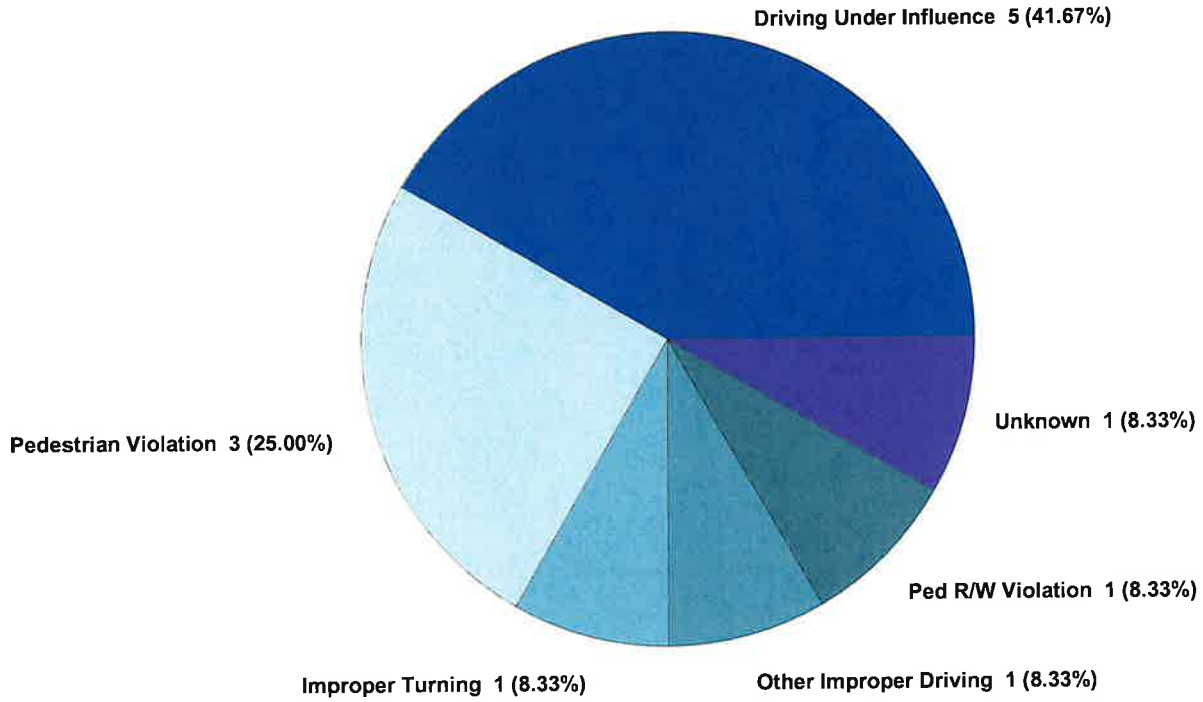

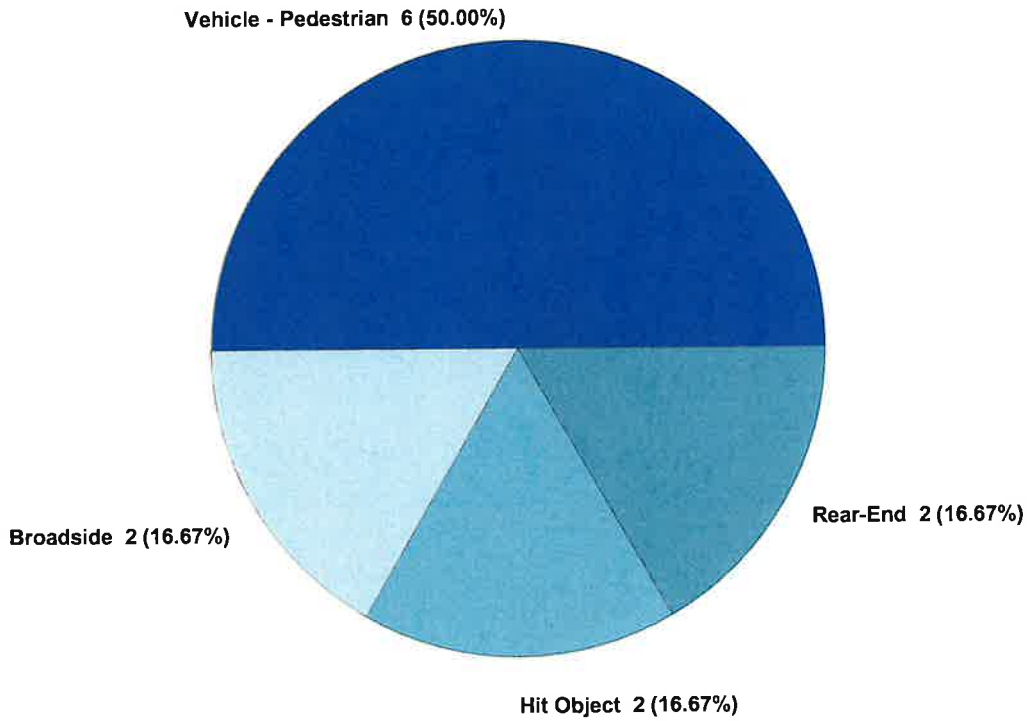

## Primary Collision Factors

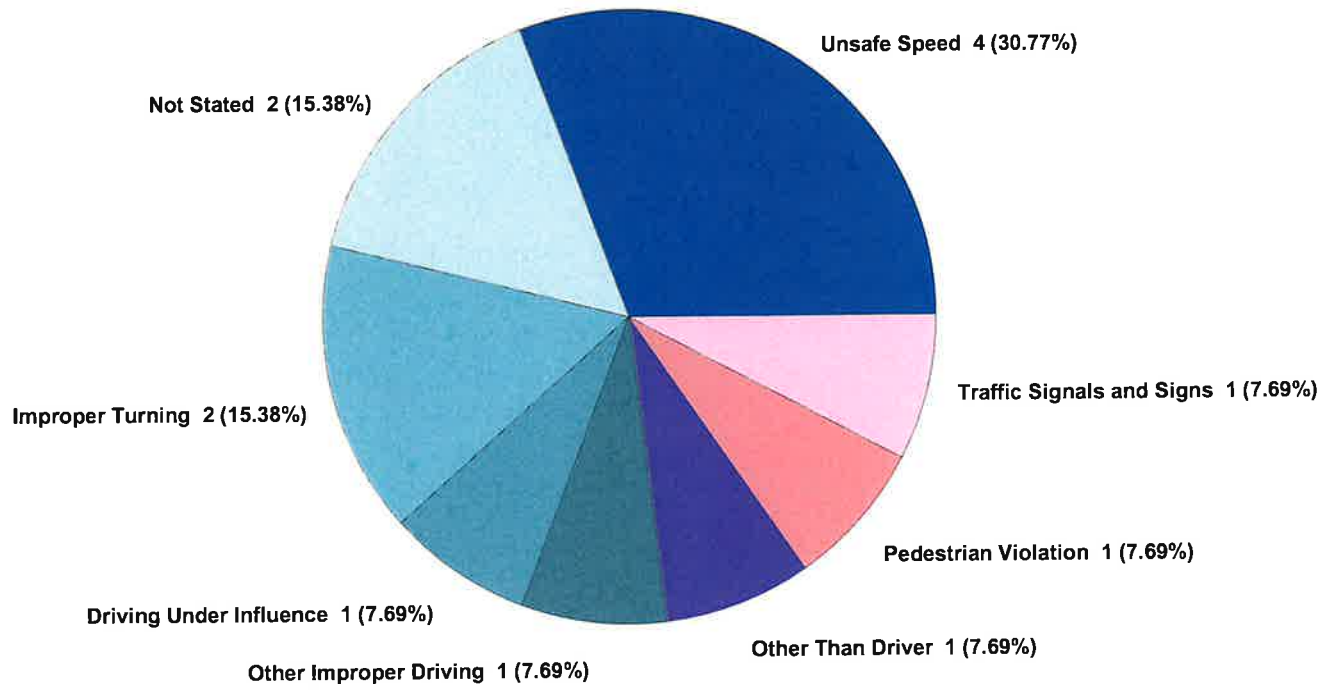

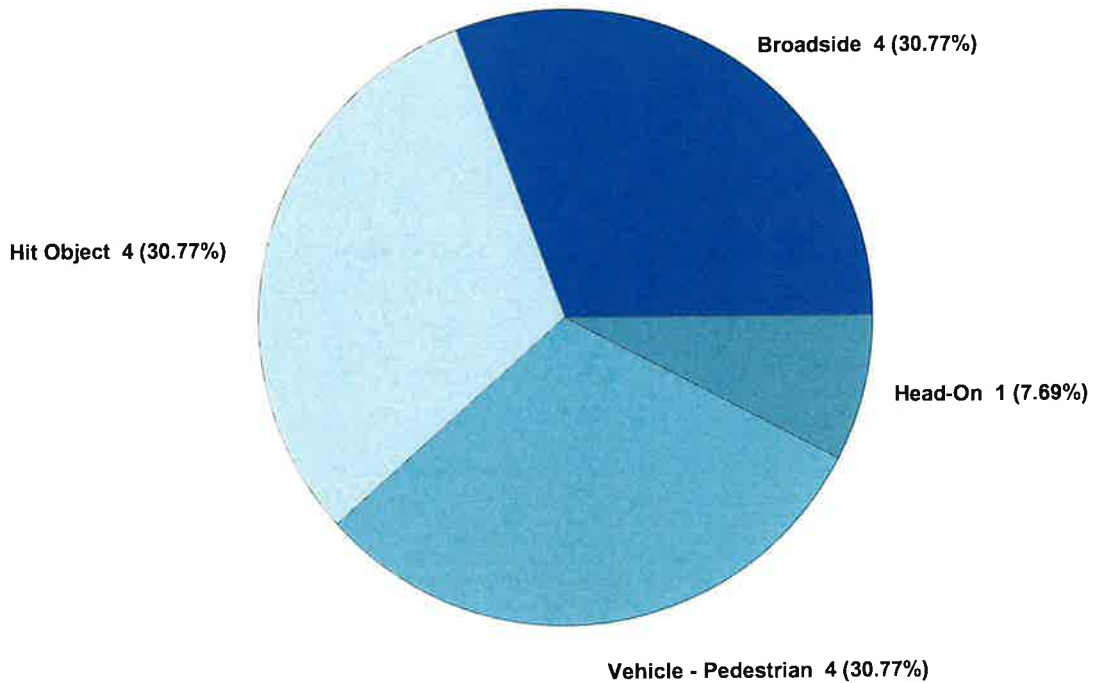

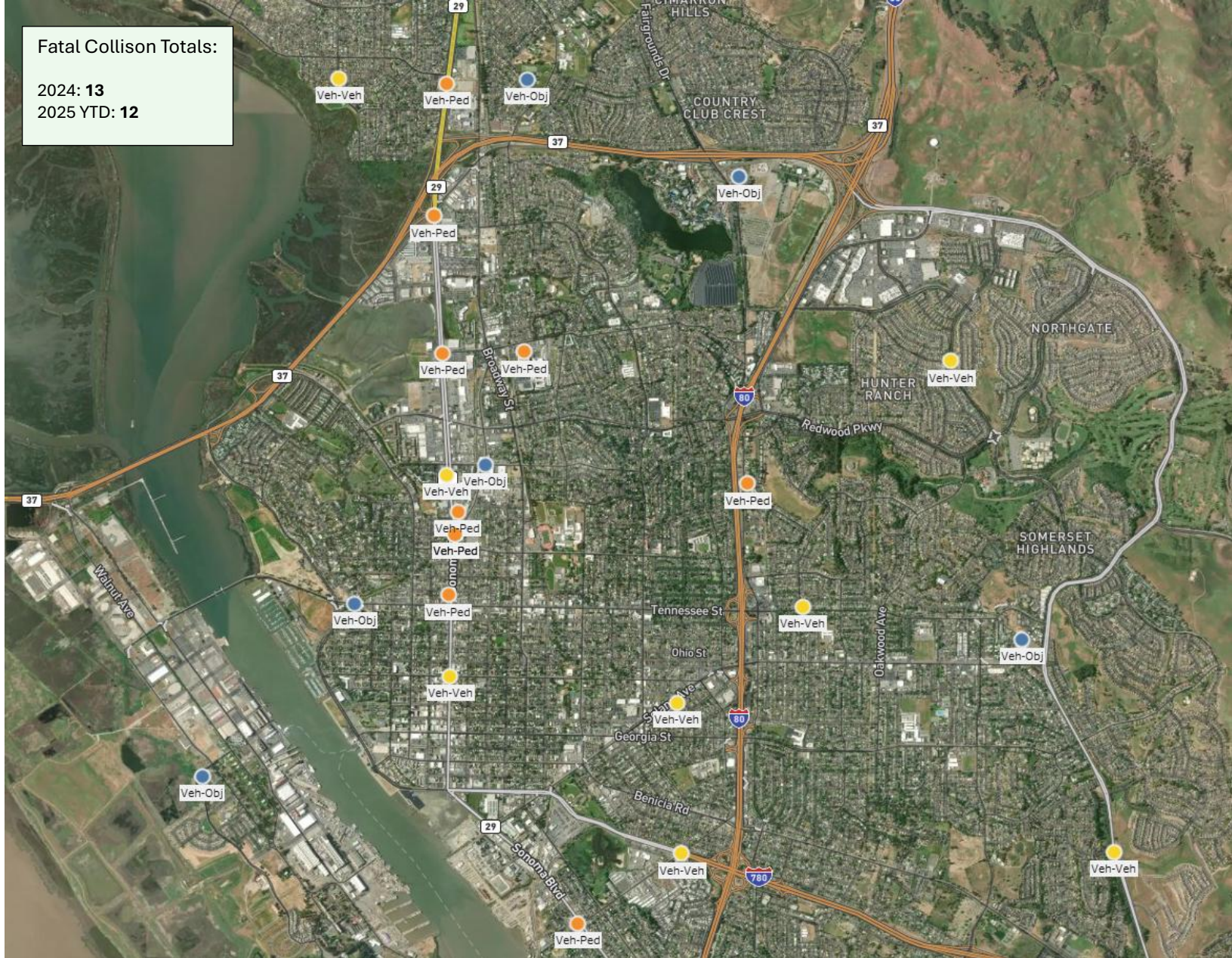
