

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 6:14 p.m.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. ROLL CALL

Present: Councilmembers Lediju and Matias.

Absent: Councilmember Palmares

Staff present: Captain Bautista, Lieutenant Huff, Lieutenant Caitham, Sergeant Hollis, City Attorney Nebb, and Assistant to the City Manager Peterson.

Community Partners Present: Reina Robinson, CEO and Founder of Center for Urban Excellence (CUE); Dionne Carter, Chief of Public Health and Safety, Center for Urban Excellence (CUE); Tanya Brownrigg, Victim Empowerment Support Team (VEST).

4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Police Operations Report Including Recruitment & Hiring: Captain Bautista reported that, as of January 2026, the Vallejo Police Department's abandoned vehicles list is down to approximately 1,856 See-Click-Fix requests after a starting point of 4,000. He discussed the crime statistics presented in the agenda packet.

Captain Bautista noted the new crime data format shows corresponding beats related to crime. There are 79 Sworn Officers, 39 on Patrol, with three in the Field Training Officer (FTO) program, and they are expected to be solo officers in April/May. There are seven recruits in several academies. Two in the Sacramento Sheriff's Office Academy, three in the Alameda Academy, and two

in the Sacramento Police Academy.

Captain Bautista provided an overview of an aging report covering multi-year data on investigative and traffic tows to present.

Lieutenant Huff met with the City Attorney's Office to rewrite the Tow Agreement for all city tow yards. The new agreement addresses capacity and storage concerns. There are six full-time Police Assistants (PAs), one part-time Cadet, and one Senior Police Assistant. As of January 2026, there have been six traffic fatalities.

Lieutenant Caitham described the investigative tow process. He mentioned the detectives will tow, process, and then search the car. He discussed whether cases have been filed with the District Attorney's Office. An additional point was made that if no person is identified, there is no person to release the car to.

6. DOMESTIC VIOLENCE ENHANCED RESPONSE

A CONTINUANCE OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE & CASE REVIEW

Lieutenant Caitham discussed the lethality threat protocol for evaluating potential threats. He mentioned officers, dispatch, and IHart went to training held on January 26 and February 26, 2026. The new resource card for victims is almost completed. He emphasized that officers need to go beyond simply arriving on scene, handing out a card, and moving on to the next call. The goal is to ensure individuals are directly connected with appropriate resources at the time of contact.

PARTNERSHIP GUEST COMMENTS:

Vallejo Empowerment Support Team (VEST), as shared by Tanya Brownrigg, is located at 1219 Monterrey Street in Vallejo. The organization provides domestic violence education, hosts weekly support groups, and is the only program of its kind in Solano County. They can also assist with emergency hotel placements for individuals in need.

She also highlighted that there are four additional advocates serving the Vallejo community, helping to expand access to support and resources throughout the city.

VALLEJO VISION PRESENTATION:

Captain Bautista provided an overview of the Vallejo Vision program, Violence Intervention Support Improving Our Neighborhoods (VISION). He explained how

the program identifies potential candidates based on specific eligibility criteria and outlined the process for selecting participants for the initiative.

Guest speakers Reina Robinson, CEO and Founder, and Dionne Carter, Chief of Public Health and Safety, discussed the role of CUE in the community.
