SUBJECT: **REVIEW AND DETERMINE WHETHER TO EXTEND THE ORDER OF REQUIRING THE WEARING OF FACE COVERINGS INDOORS IN THE CITY OF VALLEJO**

RECOMMENDATION

Review Resolution No. 21-100 N.C., a resolution ordering the use of face coverings in indoor and enclosed public spaces pursuant to the City's Emergency Powers extend the order.

This resolution was adopted August 31, 2021 and requires review by the City Council six weeks after adoption and thereafter upon referral by the City Manager.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

As was presented at the August 31 special City Council meeting, the County and City continue to remain in a substantial or high transmission of COVID-19 cases. As September 29 the City has only achieved at least 55% of the population of Vallejo who have been fully vaccinated. The City continues to face an important governmental interest in protecting the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and businesses and to maintain and enhance a high quality of life. In order to follow the sound guidance and recommendations of the CDC and the California Department of Public Health, it is in the City's best interest to continue to impose a requirement that face coverings be worn indoors and in enclosed spaces in order to curtail the spread of COVID-19.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On August 31, 2021, the City Council unanimously voted to adopt Resolution No. 21-100 N.C. (Attachment 1) ordering the use of face coverings in indoor and enclosed public spaces pursuant to the City's Emergency Powers. The resolution took effect immediately and has remained in effect for the last six weeks. The Resolution and order require the City to review the face mask mandate and emergency order within 60 days of its adoption. Thereafter, the Resolution and order will continue to remain in effect until at least 80% of the population of the City of Vallejo has achieved full vaccination status or until the City is not in a substantial or high transmission of COVID status as defined by the CDC for a 30-day period. The resolution further states that after the initial 60 day review, the order shall be reviewed by the City Council upon referral by the City Manager.

As the Council is aware, the Delta variant is more contagious than other previous strains, and is now the dominant strain of virus in Solano County. Two COVID-19 vaccines have been authorized for emergency use in the United States, and one has now received full approval. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), available evidence suggests that the currently authorized COVID-19 vaccines are highly effective against transmission, hospitalization and death for the Alpha, Beta, Gamma and Delta variants. The CDC has also indicated that emerging data suggests that fully vaccinated people who are infected with the Delta variant may be transmitting the virus to other people.

The CDC had previously issued a recommendation that unvaccinated people continue wearing face coverings indoors. In addition, in line with the above evidence, on July 27, 2021, the CDC issued a recommendation that

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fully vaccinated people wear face coverings in public indoor settings located in areas of substantial or high transmission of COVID-19. On July 28, 2021, the California Department of Public Health ("CDPH") issued its Guidance for the Use of Face Coverings. This guidance recommended, but did not mandate, fully vaccinated people to wear face coverings in indoor public settings statewide. In early August of 2021, health officers in the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Sonoma, and the City of Berkeley announced a mask mandate requiring every resident to wear a face mask indoors in public settings, regardless of vaccination status. The mandate is aimed at reducing the spread of COVID-19 amid the Delta variant surge in cases. Solano County opted not to issue a similar mandate.

As of the writing of this staff report, the CDC and CDPH guidance recommendations and mask mandates in other Bay Area counties remain in place. These counties continue to monitor the cases and hospitalizations and will make decisions on masking requirements based on the data and science.

Solano County and the City of Vallejo continue to remain at a substantial or high transmission of COVID-19 cases. As of September 29, the City of Vallejo remains at high risk with 14.6 daily positive new COVID-19 cases and at least 64.1% of the population of the City reaching at least one dose and 55% of the population of the City reaching full vaccination status.

Resolution No. 21-100 N.C. is being presented to Council this evening for review and consideration in extending the order based on the information provided in this staff report. If the Council chooses to extend the order, the resolution will remain in effect and will further be reviewed upon referral by the City Manager.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with the review and extension of requiring a mandatory use of face coverings in the City of Vallejo.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it is not a project which has a potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378.

RESOLUTION NO. 21-100 N.C.

ORDERING THE USE OF FACE COVERINGS IN INDOOR AND ENCLOSED PUBLIC SPACES PURSUANT TO THE CITY'S EMERGENCY POWERS

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 8630 empowers the City Council to proclaim the existence or threatened existence of a Local Emergency when the City is affected or likely to be affected by a public calamity; and

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 8634 empowers the City to promulgate orders and regulations to provide for the protection of life and property; and

WHEREAS, the novel Coronavirus is highly contagious and poses a threat to the wellbeing of every person, which has since March 2020 resulted in the deaths of more than 4 million Americans and over 65,000 Californians; and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid conditions of extreme peril warranted and necessitated the proclamation of the existence of a Local Emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020 the City Council of the City of Vallejo adopted Resolution 20-026 proclaiming a state of Local Emergency relating to the COVID-19 virus and its rapid transmission, based upon state and federal guidance; and

WHEREAS, despite the current availability of vaccines to slow the spread of COVID-19, the Delta variant has proved to be highly contagious, and appears to be affecting even vaccinated individuals some of whom appear to be asymptomatic but who nevertheless may be contagious; and

WHEREAS, on July 27, 2021, the CDC issued a recommendation that fully vaccinated people wear coverings in public indoor settings located in areas of substantial or high transmission of COVID-19, to reduce the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2021, the California Department of Public Health issued its Guidance for the Use of Face Coverings, recommending fully vaccinated people wear face coverings in indoor public settings statewide; and

WHEREAS, in early August 2021, health officers in the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Napa, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Sonoma and the City of Berkeley announced a mask mandate requiring every resident to wear a face mask indoors in public settings, regardless of vaccination status; and

WHEREAS, the County of Solano has not issued an order mandating the wearing of face coverings; and

WHEREAS, the City has an important governmental interest in protecting the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and businesses; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the health and safety of the City residents, visitors and businesses and in order to follow the sound guidance and recommendations of the CDC and the California Department of Public Health, the City Council finds that it is in the best interest of public health and safety, as affected by the emergency caused by the spread of COVID-19, and

necessary to issue and implement this Resolution to protect life, health and safety of its citizens and the community at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the City Council of the City of Vallejo does hereby order as follows:

SECTION 1. Face Coverings Required.

- 1. Face Covering Requirement.** Except as otherwise set forth in this Resolution, all persons, regardless of whether they are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or not fully vaccinated, shall wear well-fitted face coverings over the nose and mouth in all indoor public settings in the City. For the purposes of this Resolution, public settings include, but are not limited to, business offices, retail stores, restaurants and bars, theaters, family entertainment centers, conference and event centers, and State and local government facilities where services are provided to the public.
- 2. Operator and Host Requirements.** Businesses, government agencies and other persons that operate inside indoor public settings, or host events inside indoor public settings, shall:
 - a. At all points of entry to the indoor public setting, promptly post conspicuous signage that communicates the face covering requirement of this Resolution; and
 - b. To the greatest extent practicable, require persons subject to the face covering requirement in this Resolution to wear face coverings upon entry into and while inside the indoor public setting.
- 3. Exceptions.** The face covering requirement of this Resolution does not apply to individuals in the following circumstances:
 - a. When alone in a room.
 - b. When actively eating and/or drinking.
 - c. When swimming or showering in a fitness facility.
 - d. When receiving care or other service that requires removal of the face covering, including by way of example and without limitation, medical care requiring exposure of the nose or mouth, cosmetic services involving the face, and dental procedures.
 - e. Performers at indoor live events such as theater, opera, symphony, religious choirs, and professional sports may remove masks while actively performing or practicing, though such individuals should maximize physical distancing as much as practicable.
 - f. Participants in indoor religious gatherings may remove masks when necessary to participate in religious rituals.

- g. Persons younger than four years old.
- h. When exempt from wearing face coverings under the State Face Covering Guidance or other applicable CDPH guidance. The State Face Covering Guidance exempts the following individuals from wearing masks:
 - (1) Persons younger than two years old. Very young children must not wear a mask because of the risk of suffocation.
 - (2) Persons with a medical condition, mental health condition, or disability that prevents wearing a mask, including persons with a medical condition for whom wearing a mask could obstruct breathing or who are unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove a mask without assistance.
 - (3) Persons who are hearing impaired, or communicating with a person who is hearing impaired, where the ability to see the mouth is essential for communication.
 - (4) Persons for whom wearing a mask would create a risk to the person related to their work, as determined by local, state, or federal regulators or workplace safety guidance.

- 4. **Conflicts.** Where a conflict exists between this Resolution and more permissive standards pertaining to the wearing of face coverings set forth in any other Order of the Solano County Health Officer in effect, or between this Resolution and any State Public Health Officer order in effect or CDPH guidance in effect pertaining to the wearing of face coverings in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the more restrictive provision controls.

SECTION 2. **Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption by the City Council of the City of Vallejo and shall remain in effect for six weeks and thereafter until at least 80% of the population of the City of Vallejo has achieved full vaccination status or until the City is not in a substantial or high transmission of COVID 19 status as defined by the CDC for a thirty-day period. This Resolution shall be reviewed by the Council after six weeks and thereafter upon referral by the City Manager.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this Resolution and shall cause a certified Resolution to be filed in the Office of the City Clerk.

SUBJECT: **ADOPTON OF A RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE LOCAL EMERGENCY DECLARED ON MARCH 16, 2020 AND AUTHORIZING REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF LEGISLATIVE BODIES OF THE CITY OF VALLEJO WITH RE-RATIFICATION OCCURING EVERY 30 DAYS**

RECOMMENDATION

Adopt a resolution ratifying the proclamation of local emergency on March 16, 2020 and authorizing remote teleconference meetings of the legislative bodies of the City of Vallejo in accordance with Assembly Bill 361.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

At its September 28 regular meeting, the Council discussed whether to return to in-person City Council and board and commission meetings or to continue with teleconference meetings in accordance with the provisions and findings of AB 361. Following considerable discussion, the City Council directed staff to return to Council to take the necessary steps to continue with teleconference meetings in accordance with the provisions and findings of AB 36.

On August 31, in direct response to the addition of the Delta variant and the number of positive cases in the City of Vallejo, the City Council implemented an order requiring the use of face coverings in indoor and enclosed public spaces. As this state of local emergency continues to impact the City, in-person meetings of the City's legislative bodies would present an imminent risk to the health and safety of attendees. Continuation of virtual teleconference meetings will protect the health and safety of attendees and allow staff the time needed to work on and return to Council at its October 26 regular meeting with information and the costs of conducting hybrid meetings starting as early as the Council's November 9 regular meeting.

BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION

On March 4, 2020, Governor Newsome issued Executive Order N-29-20, which in part, suspended the Ralph M. Brown Act ("the Brown Act") requirements for the conduct of meetings via teleconference during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Governor issued Executive Order N-08-21 on June 11, 2021, extending the Brown Act modifications in Executive Order N-29-20 through September 30, 2021.

On September 16, 2021, the Governor signed Assembly Bill 361 ("AB 361"), which amends the Brown Act to allow meetings of legislative bodies to be conducted via teleconference under certain conditions during proclaimed emergencies.

On September 20, 2021, the Governor issued Executive Order N-15-21 suspending the provisions of AB 361 through September 30, 2021 and clarifying that legislative bodies may continue to meet under Executive Order N-29-20 through September 30, 2021.

**Subject: ADOPTION OF A RESOLUTION RATIFYING THE LOCAL EMERGENCY DECLARED
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AB 361 allows legislative bodies to hold meetings utilizing teleconferencing without complying with the standard teleconferencing requirements if the Governor has proclaimed a State of Emergency and any of the following circumstances occur:

- State or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or
- A meeting is being held for the purposes of determining, by majority vote, whether as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; or
- The legislative body has determined that as a result of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and or safety of attendees.

The Governor's proclaimed state of emergency and the City's proclamation of a state of Local Emergency related to the COVID-19 virus remain in effect.

If a meeting is held via teleconference under AB 361, the following requirements apply:

- Notice of the meeting must still be given in compliance with the Brown Act, and the notice must include the means by which the public may access the meeting and provide public comment.
- The public must be provided access to the meeting via a call-in option or internet-based service option and allowed to "address the legislative body directly." The agency does not have to provide an in-person option for the public to attend the meeting.
- The meeting must be conducted "in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties and the public appearing before the legislative body."
- If there is a disruption to the meeting broadcast or in the ability to take call-in or internet-based public comment, no further action can be taken on agenda items until the issue is resolved.
- The body cannot require public comments to be submitted before the start of the meeting. The public must be allowed to make "real-time" public comments.
- If the agency provides a timed public comment period, the public comment period must be left open until the time expires. If no timed public comment period is provided, a reasonable amount of time per agenda item must be provided.
- Findings must be made every 30 days to continue to conduct teleconference meetings under AB 361. The body must find it has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency and either 1) the emergency continues to impact the ability to meet safely in person, or 2) State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

The proposed resolution:

- Ratifies the City Council's proclamation that a local emergency still exists throughout the City, and that in-person meetings of the City's legislative bodies would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees; and
- Authorizes staff and the City's legislative bodies to conduct open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

If adopted, the resolution will take effect immediately upon its adoption and will be effective until the earlier of November 4, 2021, or such time as the City Council adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with

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Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the City may continue to teleconference without compliance with Government Code section 54953(b)(3).

Staff will return to Council at its October 26 regular meeting for its consideration to either continue with teleconference meetings per the provisions of AB 361 or return to in-person Council, board and commission meetings with information regarding hybrid meetings, including costs and in-person and hybrid options.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact associated with the implementation of authorizing remote teleconference meetings of legislative bodies in the City of Vallejo.

ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW

This action is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) because it is not a project which has a potential for resulting in either a direct physical change in the environment, or a reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment, pursuant to CEQA Guideline section 15378.

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF VALLEJO RATIFYING ITS
PROCLAMATION OF A LOCAL EMERGENCY DECLARED ON MARCH 16, 2020 AND
MAKING THE LEGALLY REQUIRED FINDINGS TO CONTINUE TO AUTHORIZE THE
CONDUCT OF REMOTE TELECONFERENCE MEETINGS OF THE LEGISLATIVE BODIES
OF THE CITY OF VALLEJO PURSUANT TO ASSEMBLY BILL 361**

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2020, pursuant to California Government Code Section 8625, the Governor of the State of California proclaimed a statewide state of emergency due to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 16, 2020 the City Council of the City of Vallejo adopted Resolution No. 20-026 proclaiming a state of Local Emergency relating to the COVID-19 virus and its rapid transmission, based upon state and local federal guidance; and

WHEREAS, all meetings of the City of Vallejo's legislative bodies are open and public, as required by the Brown Act (California Gov. Code sections 54950 et seq.), so that any member of the public may attend, participate, and watch the City's legislative bodies conduct their business; and

WHEREAS, beginning in March 2020, the Governor issued a series of Executive Orders, N-25-20, N-29-20, and N-35-20, that waived certain Brown Act requirements to allow legislative bodies to continue meeting while slowing the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, N-29-20 allowed the City's legislative bodies to meet via teleconference without complying with certain Brown Act requirements; and

WHEREAS, on June 11, 2021, the Governor issued Executive Order N-08-21, extending the Brown Act provisions of N-29-20 through September 30, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on September 16, 2021, Governor Newsome signed Assembly Bill 361 ("AB 361"), into law, allowing the City's legislative bodies to continue to meet via teleconference during proclaimed states of emergency under modified Brown Act requirements; and

WHEREAS, AB 361, at Government Code section 54953(e), provides for teleconferencing participation in meetings by members of a legislative body, without compliance with the requirements of Government Code section 54953(b)(3), subject to the existence of certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, AB 361 allows legislative bodies to continue to meet via teleconference when a state of emergency is declared by the Governor, pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of a disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons

or property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, AB 361 further requires that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the City Council's proclaimed local emergency remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, the City of Vallejo remains at a substantial or high transmission of COVID 19 cases and has not achieved 80% full vaccination status; and

WHEREAS, in order to protect the health and safety of the City residents and visitors and in order to follow the sound guidance and recommendations of the CDC and the California Department of Public Health, the City Council finds it is in the best interest of public health and safety, as affected by the emergency caused by the spread of COVID-19, and necessary to issue and implement this Resolution to protect life, health and safety of its citizens and the community at large.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Vallejo does hereby resolve as follows:

Section 1. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by reference.

Section 2. The City Council hereby ratifies its proclamation that a local emergency still exists throughout the City, and that in-person meetings of the City's legislative bodies would present imminent risk to the health or safety of attendees.

Section 3. The staff and legislative bodies of the City of Vallejo are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 4. In the event of disruption which prevents a legislative body of the City of Vallejo from broadcasting a meeting using a call-in option or internet-based service option, or in the event of a disruption within the City's control which prevents members of the public from offering public comment using the call-in option or internet-based service option, the legislative body shall take no further action on items appearing on a meeting agenda until public access to the meeting via the call-in option or internet-based option is restored. However, if any of the Broadcast Options are disrupted, but any of the other Broadcast Options is still available to the public, the legislative body may take further action on items appearing on a meeting agenda without waiting for the disrupted Broadcast Option(s) to be restored.

Section 5. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until October 26, 2021, or such time the City Council adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the City of Vallejo may

continue to teleconference without compliance to Government Code section 54953(b)(3).

Section 6. If any section, subsection, clause or phrase in this resolution is for any reason held invalid, the validity of the remainder of this resolution shall not be affected thereby. The City Council would have passed this resolution and each section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrases thereof, irrespective of the fact that one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses or phrases thereof to be held invalid.

Section 7. The City Clerk shall certify the adoption of this Resolution and shall cause a certified Resolution to be filed in the Office of the City Clerk.
