Family and the Road to Resilience

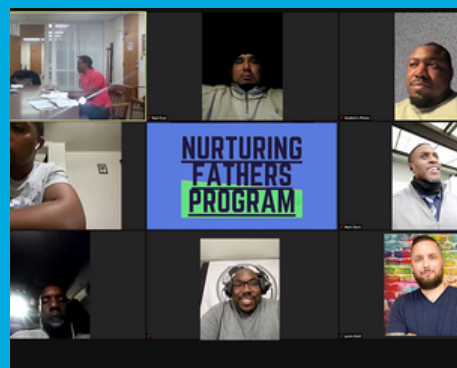
Supports pregnant women, mothers, and their families by addressing systemic conditions.
